<u>Demographic forms</u>: School Demographic forms were sent to all families through PowerSchool. Please take the time to go through these forms to correct any information that has changed over the last year. There are also some very important options to consider. Please make sure to indicate the Media Permission, Chromebook Permissions and the technology acceptable use policy. These forms are due to HRCE in early October. We appreciate your time.

<u>School Lunch Program:</u> Our School lunch Program is up and running. If you would like your child to have a lunch delivered to the school through the SN LUNCH Program, it is very important that you register for an account and order your child's lunch at <u>Nova Scotia School | nslunch</u>. We do order extra lunches for emergencies, but we cannot supply lunches to everyone, if they are not ordered through the Lunch Program.

<u>If your child is late for school</u> (after 9:05) please make sure they come to the FRONT DOOR of the school and check in with Ms. Bebe. We are having difficulty tracking student attendance when students do not check in. This is a very important aspect of our day; we do not want our Safe Arrival system to call families for students who are at school. It creates unnecessary anxiety for everyone.

<u>Universal Screening Grades 1-2:</u> In September, classroom teachers spend time getting to know their students and who they are as learners. Schools will be using *Universal Screening in Reading* for Grade 1 and 2 students. *This is one of the many ways teachers will assess learning.*

What is Universal Screening in Reading:

It's a short (1–5 minute) activity that helps us see how your child is developing key reading skills. Think of it as a quick check-in on their reading journey, like looking at a map to see where they are and what might help them move forward.

Why do we do it?

The screening helps teachers understand children's strengths and where they may need extra support. This allows us to plan instruction, so students get what they need to succeed in reading.

Important to know:

This is *not* a test. There's no "pass" or "fail." It's a way for teachers to ensure students are supported in their learning.

<u>Life Threatening Allergies:</u> We have several life-threatening allergies at Bicentennial. Please make sure that your children do not bring nuts or nut products to school.

<u>Free Tutoring Program:</u> If you are looking for FREE in-person math tutoring for grades 4 to 9, there is a new drop-in program at Woodlawn Public Library which starts this Thursday, September 18 until November 20, 2025 from 4:30-6:00pm.

<u>School Advisory Council</u>: Welcome back to school, our 2025-26 year is shaping up to be fantastic! The first Student Advisory Council Meeting of the year for Bicentennial School will be held on **Monday September 22nd at 6pm** in the school staff room.

What does the SAC do? The SAC is a council designed for opinion sharing to help guide spending decisions in Bicentennial's school community. If you have questions about the school and school community you can find out more at SAC meetings.

Who is Welcome? EVERYONE. We have two options available: in-person in the staff room (kids are welcome) or on Google Meets. You can officially become a voting elected member of the committee or you can attend any meeting as a non-voting member to garner information about our school. We also welcome anyone who is a community member (without a current Bicentennial student).

Together we can make our school work for everyone.

<u>Physical Education</u>: As we begin a new year of physical education classes, we would like to pass along a few reminders. Wearing appropriate footwear is essential for both safety and care of our facilities. Proper shoes help prevent injuries and also protect our newly updated gymnasium floors, so they remain in great condition for years to come. Please ensure your child(ren) are wearing/bringing sneakers on the days they have P.E. classes.

Additionally, we encourage our junior high students to bring a change of clothes for P.E. class. This allows them to participate comfortably, freely, and avoid wearing damp clothing for the rest of the school day.

<u>Lunch Supervisors</u>: If you are interested in being a school Lunch Supervisor, please reach out to our Bicentennial Email address (<u>bicent@hrce.ca</u>) to let us know. Lunch supervisors are very important to our School Community. We can offer between one and four hours per day depending on availability. If you have been a Bicentennial School Lunch Supervisor before, please contact Ms. Birdsall if you would like to return.

<u>Water:</u> Please send your child to school with a **full water bottle that has a secure top**. Water refill stations are available at various locations throughout the school and children will have access to water if they run out or spill their bottle

<u>Sick Children</u>: If your child is sick, please do not send him/her/them to school. You may report their absence through the Safe Arrival App (1-833-582-6940) or contact the school to report their absence. 1-833-582-6940.

<u>Cell Phones:</u> Cell phones are <u>not permitted</u> for student use during instructional hours in Grades 7-9. P-6 students are not allowed to use phones at any time during the school day. Cell phones can create conflict and privacy concerns. Students have access to the school phone for parent/guardian contact during school hours.
