Classroom Climate

- Student behaviour in some grade 9 classrooms has been pretty disruptive. Makes things difficult for newer teachers, especially.
- Principal Hartlen is drafting a plan to help talk through some of these challenges with the students and to work on plans to keep students in the classroom while restoring respectful and kind behaviour.
- Ms. Webber is looking at student leadership programs for Grade 9s at lunch time to help build community.
- Question: Is this typical behaviour each year or has it gotten worse?
 - It's typical. It usually lasts for part of the first term until the school counselor comes in and introduces Grade 10 course selection, at which point students realize that they need to buckle down.

- Have there been any requests for funds from the SAC grant?
 - There's always room for technology, though we have had good luck sourcing equipment lately.
 - We're looking for 60 new pairs of safety goggles for the gym
- Any other ideas?
 - A few standing desks for the Jr High classrooms
 - Additional seating options for Jr High
- Principal Hartlen will put something in the memo on Friday for teachers to source ideas that need funding
